

PLB is a public taxing entity, commonly known as a “Senate Bill 40 Board,” that enters into funding contracts with agencies that serve individuals with developmental disabilities in St. Louis County.

PLB invests over \$23 million in St. Louis County to create opportunities for people to thrive in the community and employment settings of their choosing.

**Community Services** focus on providing supports which enable individuals to successfully live in their home or the home of the natural family, and participate as members of the community.

**Employment Services** focus on providing supports which enable individuals to successfully work in the setting of their choice.



**EMPOWERMENT ACROSS A LIFETIME:**

PLB empowers people throughout their lifetime by investing tax dollars in carefully selected projects that make a difference in people’s lives.

**2019 ACHIEVEMENTS**

- Celebrated 40 years of investing in support services for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- Launched a new website that is more informative and reflective of PLB services.
- Launched the Eastern Region Alliance, a collaboration between the four St. Louis area SB40 Boards to help efficiently use taxpayer dollars and reduce administrative burden on service providers.
- Appropriated \$200,000 to provide supports for 122 individuals through the Partnership for Hope, a collaboration with the Department of Mental Health.

**2019 IMPACT**

- Over 4,600** people received supports to live and work in their community
- 1,698** people were employed in jobs of their choice
- 271** received transportation to work
- 1,779** participated in the community
- 413** people lived independently in their own home
- 1,586** families received temporary support
- 94%** of individuals stated PLB funded services helped them reach their goals and become more independent
