

INVESTING IN OPPORTUNITIES FOR PEOPLE WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

PLB is a public taxing entity, commonly known as a "Senate Bill 40 Board," that enters into funding contracts with agencies that serve individuals with developmental disabilities in St. Louis County.

PLB invests over \$23 million in St. Louis County to create opportunities for people to thrive in the community and employment settings of their choosing.

Community Services focus on providing supports which enable individuals to successfully live in their home or the home of the natural family, and participate as members of the community.

Employment Services focus on providing supports which enable individuals to successfully work in the setting of their choice.



2019 ACHIEVEMENTS

- Celebrated 40 years of investing in support services for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- Launched a new website that is more informative and reflective of PLB services.
- Launched the Eastern Region Alliance, a collaboration between the four St. Louis area SB40 Boards to help efficiently use taxpayer dollars and reduce administrative burden on service providers.
- Appropriated \$200,000 to provide supports for 122 individuals through the Partnership for Hope, a collaboration with the Department of Mental Health.

2019 IMPACT

Over 4,600 people received supports to live and work in their community

1,698 people were employed in jobs of their choice

271 received transportation to work

1,779 participated in the community

413 people lived independently in their own home

1,586 families received temporary support

94% of individuals stated PLB funded services helped them reach their goals and become more independent
