

The Productive Living Board (PLB) is a public taxing entity, commonly known as a "Senate Bill 40 Board." The organization was established in 1979 when St. Louis County voters approved a property tax to develop services that support residents with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). PLB funds 37 agencies that provide the expert services needed for over 4,600 individuals in St. Louis County to live as respected and included members of their community.
