
Who we are

Our In 2021 \$20,012,059 provided opportunities to nearly 4,000 individuals with developmental disabilities

3,978 people received supports to live and work in their community

1,159 participated in the community

1,245 families temporarily received additional in-home or facility-based care

379 people lived independently in their own home

1,420 people were employed in jobs of their choosing

266 people received employment training

159 received transportation to work

19 agencies received \$703,000 to support emerging needs
