# Our Impact

In 2021 **\$20,012,059** provided opportunities to nearly **4,000 individuals** with developmental disabilities that allow them to fulfill their potential and live as respected and included members of the community.

**3,978** people received supports to live and work in their community

**1,420** people were employed in jobs of their choosing

**1,159** participated in the community

**266** people received employment training

**1,245** families temporarily received additional in-home or facility-based care

**159** received transportation to work

**379** people lived independently in their own home

**19** agencies received \$703,000 to support emerging needs

**Sheltered Employment:** adaptive work environments with tasks and pay tailored to individuals' unique needs and skill sets
